VAN DYK FILES FOR RALEIGH COUNCIL DISTRICT D

RALEIGH - Local businessman and community advocate Ted Van Dyk today filed to run for the Raleigh City Council representing District D.

"District D is at the crossroads of Raleigh's future," Van Dyk said. "I will bring a positive, moderate, and strong voice to the people of District D. I will work to find consensus with other members of the Council to find common-sense solutions to Raleigh's challenges."

Ted's priorities include working to foster a strong economy with smart and balanced growth, including expanded transit options. He understands that we have work to do to make our streets and neighborhoods safer. He will work to jump-start the process of creating a great park and recreation area at the Dorthea Dix campus. And, Ted will lead the way in efforts to be more inclusive at the front end of decision-making by including all of our district's diverse stakeholders."

Van Dyk sits on the Raleigh Appearance Commission, the Hillsborough Street Partnership executive committee, Hillsborough Street Business Improvement District steering committee, and is a committee chair for the Urban Land Institute's Triangle Chapter. He has supported the Helping Hand Mission and Habitat for Humanity, as well as Preservation North Carolina, YMCA Triangle, and other area service organizations.

He founded New City Design Group in 1996 after professional experience with firms in Seattle and Raleigh. Ted received a B.A. in History from Duke University in 1983 and a M.A. in Industrial Design from North Carolina State University in 1986. In 1992, he received a M.A. in Architecture from the University of Washington College of Architecture and Urban Planning.

Ted, 48, and his wife, Pam live on Hawthorne Street with their two children Spencer, 17, and Grace, 14, who both attend Broughton High School.
